Notice from John Momot and Dave

After a slow start to the summer it has turned into a real nice one.

It time to start thinking about next season and making your arrangements to reserve your site.

All existing guest on the "fixed income program" locked in through 2014 will automatically be extended through 2015 and NOT receive any increase to their contracted site pricing.

Electric reimbursement will NOT increase as well.

It was our great pleasure to serve you this past season and we look forward to serving

you again next season.

EZ Pay Program - Due to the positive response of the EZ PAY program, we will again be offering this as an option. How to determine what your four EZ PAY payments will be 25% of your site rental is due by October 1st and your remaining 3 payments are due in the spring of next year.

- For Example: 2015 site rent = \$1,045.00.
- Fall deposit = \$261.25. Site balance = \$783.75.
- Take \$783.75 and divide by 3 = \$261.25

If you do not pay 25% of your site rental in the fall, there will be a one-time charge of \$45 to activate the EZ PAY program in order to be fair to those who made their fall deposit on time.

- For Example: 2015 site rent = \$1,045.00.
- Fall deposit none. Late charge = \$45.00.
- Site balance = \$1,090.00.
- Take \$1,090.00 and divide by 3 = \$363.33
 This would allow you to activate the EZ PAY Program if a deposit was not made in the fall.

EZ PAY FINAL PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

- 2nd payment: Monday, April 1, 2015
- 3rd payment: Wednesday, May 1, 2015
- 4th payment: Saturday, June 1, 2015

Final 3 payments will be as scheduled above, \$5.00 will be added to each payment that is late. If you activate EZ PAY in the spring and did not make a deposit, your 1st payment would be due on April 1st, your second payment is still due by May 1st and the final payment by June 1st. Site contracts NOT paid by June 1st will be charged a \$50.00 late fee, no matter what payment option you choose. Applicable interest fees still apply.

Site Rent

It will soon be time to think about leaving deposits for the 2015 season. As you are aware, we can not take your deposit for the 2015 season unless your balance for 2014 is paid in full. As well, if you do not make a deposit for 2015, there will be a \$45.00 no deposit fee and this will be hard for us to guarantee your site for 2015.

Golf Cart Storage

Facilities update:

Along with the normal everyday upkeep and repairs we did some work around the dumpster area to make thing neater.

We have trimmed trees and cleaned up around the dumpster and recycling area and moved the dumpsters and walkways further back off the roadway. We also put a coat of stain on all of the wood to give everything a fresh look.

We purchased a new 20x40 event tent with sidewalls to be used for events throughout the season.

Follow up to the what will happen to the Southside pool.

After listening to many opinions of our guest it appears the Southside pool is not as popular as some other possible facilities.

So, we have made the decision to fill the South Side pool in this fall.

The most popular opinion on what facilities would be more popular were:

- 1. Open party pavilion near the clubhouse
- 2. Internet Cafe in either the old Snack Shack or Clubhouse
- 3. Permanent BBQ area
- 4. Splash park

We will spend this winter investigating the feasibility of the items on this list.

After we have done our research we will provide our direction Spring of 2015.

Energy conservation:

It is our busiest time of the year. The hot weather has pushed the regions electric distribution systems to peak capacity. We recently experienced some issues with the electrical systems apparently going down. As it ended up, most of the problems came from New York Electric and Gas and their ability to provide power to our area. They were extremely helpful last week and reacted very quickly to correct what they could. All the issues may not get corrected in the near feature and they only become a problem in extreme heat when everyone is using their Air Conditioner. We can all help prevent a brown-out and breaker failure by conserving the electricity during the peak weekends. Run as many appliances on LP as possible and unplug non-essential devices like golf cart chargers. As an alternative, try a solar panel to keep your golf cart topped off!

Here are some examples of energy usage for some common items:

- $\ \square$ Air conditioner 15 amps peak and running at 4 to 7amps
- House type Refrigerator 15 amps at its peak and 3 to 5amps while running
- ☐ Golf cart chargers 15 amps constant
- □ Microwave oven 15 amps while cooking
- 🛮 Gas Grill O amps
- 🛘 Electric water heater 10 to 15amps
- $\ensuremath{\square}$ RV Refrigerator 2 to 4 amps almost constant

Mail:

 Please stop into the office and check the mail box. The box is full of various guests' mail, and your mail could be here!

Issues in the Park:

- Please see Dave or Theresa in the office for any park issues, so they can arrange to have them taken care of.

Golf Cart reminders:

- All golf carts MUST obey the post speed limit of 5 mph.
- No one under the age of 16 is allowed to drive a golf cart.
- All golf carts need to have lights to be driven at night.
- Please register the golf carts with the office and have a registered number on them.
- When you sell your golf cart, please remember the new owner must register
 their new golf cart in their name and get
 a new number from the office.

Notice From Management:

We had been made aware of several people that are putting their household trash in the trash cans around the children's playground and at the bathhouses. Please do not do this. This misplacement of garbage will draw wild animals to the cans, unsanitary, the smells bad and looks unpleasant. It is not fair to everyone else that brings there trash to the dumpsters. Please refrain from using the trash cans in our common areas, play ground and bathhouse for household trash, Thank You Management.

Trash:

- Please do not put household trash in the trash cans near the bathhouses and/or common areas.
- There are dumpsters on the South Side beside the pool to be used for trash.
- Please do NOT put wood of any kind in the dumpsters. Just leave it on the ground and our employees with take care of it.
- If you need help finding the dumpsters, any staff member would be glad to show you where they are located.

Additional Tips for Seasonal Campers

There are some simple things you could do to prevent damage to your unit under heavy snow load. A simple 2x4 brace in areas where there is little vertical support such as the roof rafters in the living rooms or any large open areas. Contact John for more information.

Please understand that we can not guarantee against any freeze damage if we are asked to do this after October first or after the first freeze (whichever comes first).

<u>Keys!</u>

Even if we are not winterizing your camper, it is a good idea to have a set in the office in the event of an emergency and we need to get into your unit.







Winterization Tips

This week we will review winterizing your camper using Compressed air only:

1. Fresh water tank & low point drain

- Open low point drain
- Open fresh water drain valve
 - Leave open until done.

2. Water Heater

- Open pressure and temperature valve.
- Remove drain plug.
- By-pass located inside trailer on back side of water heater
 - 3 valve system: open center valves and close both valves going to water heater.
 - 2 valve system: close to water heater and open to bypass
 - 1 valve system: close to water heater and open to bypass. Note blow out plug will need to be reinstalled to force air back into system.

3. Compressed Air Setup

- Open Hot and Cold tape on a faucet at end of the trailer.
- Flush Toilet and hold open and place a stick or "Johnny Chock" down hole to hold blade open.
- Connect blow out plug to city water fill
- · Connect air hose to city water fill.
- Start Compressor
 - Don't exceed manufacture limit's for line pressure, if unknown max. 50 psi, let run until vapor is coming out of water heater.
- By-pass located inside trailer on back side of water heater
 - 3 valve system: open center valves and close both valves going to water heater.
 - 2 valve system: close to water heater and open to bypass
 - 1 valve system: close to water heater and open to bypass, (note blow out plug will need to be reinstalled to force air back into system.

4. Fixtures

- Open both hot and cold taps and wait until vapor is coming out, close and move on.
- Kitchen tap
 - Remove gooseneck spouts to ensure water is out
- Kitchen faucet sprayer (if equipped)
- Lavatory
- Tub faucet
- Shower hose
 - Open head and remove hose from faucet to let water to ensure water is out. Close and reattach.
- Toilet
 - Leave blade open
 - Outside shower (if equipped)
 - Open head and remove hose from faucet to let water to ensure water is out. Close and reattach.
- Waste tank flusher (if equipped)
- Ice maker on refer (if equipped)
- Fresh water filter remove drain and replace (if equipped)
- Water pump
 - Remove water line on both side of pump to ensure water has drained out.

Winterization Close Up

1. Traps

- Pour a cup of antifreeze to each drain or take trap apart and pour water out. Wipe up spills.
 - Kitchen
 - Lavatory
 - Tub
 - Toilet equipped with over flow drain.

2. Close up

- Close low point drains
- · Reconnect pump lines
- Shower hoses
- Replace water filter (if equipped)
- Reconnect

3. Water Heater

- Close water heater by-pass and open valve to water heater.
- Reinstall drain plug on water heater
 - Don't leave anode rod type plug submerged in Anti freeze
- Close pressure and temperature safety valve.

4. Refrigerator

- Remove anything that could freeze.
- Clean crumple several sheets of news paper up and place in freezer and ref compartment. Or leave the doors open.

5. General close up

- Check cabinets and storage areas and remove anything that could freeze.
- Think of using MAXX airs to protect roof domes.
- If possible, tip unit so that water run off easily

6. Tires

- Park trailer so that tires on boards $2" \times 6"$ planks (Or larger).
- · Check air pressure
