
Events for this week

According to Verizon Wireless, they have given us an option for Wifi. A current Verizon Wireless customer can buy a hot spot device called a Verizon Jetpack.

There are many different plans out there: One plan allows you to purchase a Jetpack at \$49.00 with a 2 year contract The monthly charge is \$40.00 for 6 GB, (This is above your monthly contract price)

This service can be used year round, but this can be suspended at anytime with no charge. The suspension is three months at a time. If you want to suspend this longer, you will need to call Verizon Wireless. But the suspension will add more time on your two year contract.
