Some Reminders:

- We are aware that our Canadian campers are not allowed to bring fresh fruits and vegetables across the border. We want to let you know that Varin's Market is now carrying a good assortment of fresh produce. You might want to stop by and take a look. They are local and the prices are competitive.
- We are asking all of our seasonal campers
 that have pets to please come to the office.
 We need you to sign the pet policy and give
 a copy of your updated shot records for our
 files. Please do this as soon as possible.
- If you would like us to put something in the Gazette it needs to be submitted to us by no later than 12:00pm on Tuesday.

Parking on Empty Sites: We are asking all of our campers and guests to not park on any of our empty lots. We have several reservations for the weekend and it makes it hard and time consuming for us and our guests coming in if we have to go looking for someone to have a vehicle moved off a site.

<u>Visitors:</u> Guests, extended family, friends, or contractors must register at the Camp Store. There is NO CHARGE to register prior or upon arrival. If your guests pass and have to be asked to register, there will be a \$5 per

person, per day charge.

<u>Contractors</u>: Contractors must obtain written permission from the campground management prior to preforming any service with the campground. They must supply the following:

- \$45 registration fee.
- Business license.
- Sales tax certificate.
- Certificate of Insurance that must list Gunboat Rock Campground, Momot Trailer Sales, and John Momot.

Contractors that don't comply will be asked to leave immediately.

Vehicle Parking:

- A maximum of 2 automobiles may be parked at a site. Additional parking is available at the Camp Store lot.
- A maximum of 1 golf cart per site.
- Power boats on trailers may take the place of one of the cars allowed on the site.
