# <u>Tip:</u>

As everyone knows the ticks are bad this year. Here are some homemade repellents that will keep them away and they are inexpensive and chemical free.





- 1. In a spray bottle, mix 2 cups of apple cider vinegar and 1 cup of water.
- 2. Add **20 drops of your favorite essential oil**. Eucalyptus oil is a calm, soothing scent that also works as a tick repellent, while peppermint and citrus oils give off a strong crisp scent that repels ticks. This way you won't smell like bitter vinegar all day!
- 3. Place the top onto the bottle and shake well.
- 4. After mixing the solution, spray onto clothing, skin, and hair before going outdoors. Reapply every four hours to keep ticks at bay, and examine the skin and hair when returning home to make sure no ticks are on the body.

### **Repellent for Pets:**

- Add 1 cup of water to a spray bottle, followed by 2 cups of apple cider vinegar. Ticks hate the smell and taste of vinegar, and will be easily be repelled by this ingredient alone.
- 2. Add **two spoonfuls of vegetable or almond oil**, which both contain sulfur (another natural tick repellent).
- 3. Mix in a few spoonfuls of lemon juice, citrus oil, geranium oil, or peppermint oil, which will all repel ticks and fleas while also

creating a scented repellent.

- 4. Place the top onto the bottle and shake well.
- 5. Spray onto the pet's dry coat, staying away from sensitive areas including eyes, nose, mouth, and genitals. When outdoors for an extended period, spray this solution on two to three times per day, otherwise once per day is fine.

Please consult with your medical provider or your pet's veterinarian before trying any new products.

### Some Reminders:

 We are aware that our Canadian campers are not allowed to bring fresh fruits and vegetables across the border. We want to let you know that Varin's Market is now carrying a good assortment of fresh

produce. You might want to stop by and take a look. They are local and the prices are competitive.

- We are asking all
- of our seasonal campers that have pets to please come to the office. We need you to sign the pet policy and give a copy of your updated shot records for our files. Please do this as soon as possible.
- If you would like us to put something in the Gazette it needs to be submitted to us by no later than 12:00pm on Tuesday.

**Parking on Empty Sites**: We are asking all of our campers and guests to not park on any of our empty lots. We have several reservations for the weekend and it makes it hard and time consuming for us and our guests coming in if we have to go looking for someone to have a vehicle moved off a site.

**Visitors:** Guests, extended family, friends, or contractors must register at the Camp Store. There is NO CHARGE to register prior or upon arrival. If your guests pass and have to be asked to register, there will be a \$5 per person, per day charge.

**Contractors:** Contractors must obtain written permission from the campground management prior to preforming any service with the campground. They must supply the following:

- \$45 registration fee.
- Business license.
- Sales tax certificate.
- Certificate of Insurance that must list Gunboat Rock Campground, Momot Trailer Sales, and John Momot.

Contractors that don't comply will be asked to leave immediately.
