2018 Site Rent Deposits: We will soon start taking site deposits for 2018. As with every other season, we cannot take your deposit if you have any overdue balances on your account for site rent, power, or service work. Please come to the office and check to be sure that you are up to date on your account. Payments can be made at either the Blue Haven Office or the Plattsburgh Office. To avoid a \$45.00 no deposit fee, make your deposit by October 1., 2017. See below for the EZ Payment Plan information and new policy for the 2018 season. 2018 Seasonal Site Rent: There will be some increases in standard site rent this season. No one will receive more than a \$75.00 increase. Lock in dates through 2017 will now be locked in until 2020. Please remember every cart needs to be registered with the Office and have the number we assigned and only that number on them. Also all carts need to have head lights and tail lights that work. Any cart found to be without the correct numbers or with no numbers will be given one warning. The second time the cart will have to leave the campground, not to return. If you have a cart and it is not regis-

tered with the office or does not have a number, please see Dave or Theresa as soon as possible. We will be checking all carts throughout the rest of the fall. When site deposits come due we will be re-doing the list. Winterizations, awning roll-ups, and gazebo take downs will stay the same price this season.

EZ Pay Program: Due to the positive response of the EZ PAY program, we will again be offering this as an option. How to determine what your four EZ Pay payments will be: 25% of your site rental is due by October 1st and your remaining 3 payments are due in the spring of next year.

- For Example: 2018 site rent = \$1,045.00.
- Fall deposit = \$261.25. Site balance = \$783.75.
- Take \$783.75 and divide by 3 = \$261.25
- If you do not pay 25% of your site rental in the fall, there will be a one-time charge of \$45 to activate the EZ PAY program in order to be fair to those who made their fall deposit on time.
- For Example: 2018 site rent = \$1,045.00.
- Fall deposit = none. Late charge = \$45.00.
- Site balance = \$1,090.00.
- Take \$1,090.00 and divide by 3 = \$363.33
 (This would allow you to activate the EZ Pay

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Program if a deposit was not made in the fall.)

EZ Pay Payment Schedule:

- 2nd payment: Sunday, April 1st, 2018.
- 3rd payment: Monday, May 1st, 2018.

4th payment: Thursday, June 1st, 2018. The final 3 payments will be as scheduled above. \$5.00 will be added to each payment that is late. If you activate EZ Pay in the spring and did not make a deposit, your 1st payment would be due on April 1st, your second payment is still due by May 1st and the final payment by June 1st. Site contracts not paid by June 1st will be charged a \$50.00 late fee, no matter what payment option you choose. Applicable interest fees still apply. Beginning in the 2015 season and going forward, Anyone who does not pay their site rent in full by June 1st, for two consecutive seasons, will see an increase of \$75 in their site rental. This does include anyone who makes special arrangements to be paid after June 1st. Regular missed payment fees and interest still apply. Book. The policy clearly states that all site rentals must be paid by June 1^{...}, no matter what payment plan you choose. You can get an updated page for your policy book from Theresa at the office. **Final Power Reading:** The final meter reading will be done the week of September 26th.

- Please come to the office and check the mail box and the lost and found. We have mail that has not been picked up in the box and there are a few items in the lost and found box.
- Please remember when having packages shipped to the campground, the mail will be sent to the Plattsburgh office as of October 13th. Anything sent to Blue Haven after that will go to the other office.
