Changes to Your Site

Please remember:

- Before you **DIG** anywhere on your site
- Before you BUILD anything on your site
- Before you CUT anything on your site
- Before you BUY anything for your site

You MUST check with the office as this will avoid an uncomfortable situation for either party involved. This will protect our infrastructure from damages while maintaining the Natural Beauty surrounding us here in the park.

Visitors and Contractors

All non-residents MUST register with the office before entering the park. This is for your own safety, as well as your neighbor's security. This includes (but not limited to):

- Direct TV
- Wood deliveries
- Someone delivering or retrieving a camper
- Someone working on your camper
- Visitors to your site

Please make us aware to be expecting any guests.

We are Hiring We are in need of a few candidates to fill a few positions. If you or someone you know has experience or interest in this position, please contact Dave or Tim in the office.

- Night Watchmen
- Lifeguards. Candidates must be Certified and have a valid CPR certification.

General Guidelines:

While this list is NOT designed to replace the Policy Handbook, here are some offenses often brought to my attention or have seen personally:

- The Speed Limit within the park is 5MPH
- Those riding bicycles are subject to traffic laws including speed limit, ride on the right, stopping at stop signs, and helmet use is required for riders 14 and under.
- STOP signs are up to protect everyone obey them and keep everyone safe.
- Golf Cart drivers MUST be 16 and have a valid driver's license.
- The river and lake are both New York State
 Protected Waterways and you may not disturb
 the rocks, change the flow, or construct
 anything on the bank or in the water.
- Quiet hours on weekdays 10pm to 9am and on weekends and holidays 11pm to 10am
- Space heaters are not allowed.
- Second refrigerators are limited to 36" tall

HOPE: Hope is defined as an optimistic state of mind that is based on an expectation of positive outcomes with respect to

COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR CAMPGROUND OPERATORS & STAFF



Clean & Sanitize Surfaces Frequently

- Surfaces to be cleaned frequently include (but are not limited to): door knobs, common areas, and bathhouses.
- Use cashless payment options whenever possible.
- Use substances containing quaternary ammonia (quat) or sodium hypochlorite (bleach). Visit EPA.gov for more COVID-19-registered disinfectants.



Wash Hands Often

- Hands should be washed frequently for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- Wash hands immediately after: coughing, sneezing, blowing your nose, eating or drinking, touching your face, using the restroom, cleaning or handling dirty dishes, or touching contaminated surfaces.



Practice Social Distancing

- Maintain at least 6 feet separation between all campers and staff;
 all campers should stay at their campsites except for essential needs.
- · No large groups should form on beaches, playgrounds or at pools.
- Campers should not congregate at another camper's site.
 No parties of any kind.
- Limit visitors.



Keep Sick Campers at their Campsites

- Campers who begin to feel ill with symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, difficulty breathing) or any other illness MUST stay at their campsites.
- Ill campers should travel only for medical care and call ahead to alert the medical provider they are coming.
