MID-SUMMER GOLF CART SPECIAL:

With the border being closed and the uncertainty of when it will reopen, we have had a lot of concerns about golf carts. We have come up with a plan to take care of your cart and put it back in storage (INSIDE):

- Checking air pressure in all tires and topping off as needed
- Checking fluid level in all batteries and topping off as needed
- Charging batteries and having ready for storage
- Rinse off carts of any dust
- Storing golf carts inside until May 1st 2022
- SPECIAL \$180 tax incl.
- Must be paid when signing contract

Blue Haven Campground Policy Reminder:

We have a lot of new families in the park this season. We want to remind everyone of a few of our policies here within the park. These guidelines have been set to ensure the **SAFETY** and **ENJOYMENT** of **ALL** of our guests while at Blue Haven. We all need to follow them and here are just a few reminders:

<u>GOLF CART POLICY</u> - Operating Golf Carts in the Camparound is a **PRIVILEGE**.

- Absolutely no gas powered golf carts, only electric powered are permitted.
- One cart is allowed per site and it must be registered with the Campground.
- You will be assigned a cart number and you must display that number as follows:
 - Numbers must be at least 3" high in a contrasting color
 - Displayed on two opposite sides (front/back OR side/side)
- There is a \$45 annual registration fee.
- Speed limit within the park is 5MPH for ALL vehicles, cars, golf carts, and bicycles.
- Golf Carts MUST be limited to the number of passengers the cart is designed to carry.
- NO ONE UNDER 16 YEARS OF AGE ARE ALLOWED TO DRIVE THE CART
- Golf Cart Chargers draw a significant amount of power, so please unplug your chargers when not in use, and especially in high electric use times.
- Golf Carts MUST have headlights and tail lights to operate at night.

For those who do not follow the guidelines above. We will take action(s) as necessary:

- 1st Offense: A warning will be issued.
- 2nd Offense: The Golf Cart will be grounded to your site for one (1) month.
- 3rd Offense: The Golf Cart will need to be removed from the Campground.
- NO EXCEPTIONS

Our team will be making sure that everyone is following the rules.

Pet Guideline Reminder:

Pets must be kept quiet, confined, tethered, cleaned up after, and leashed at all times when on your site or when walking the grounds.



What makes Blue Haven so Special?

What DOES make Blue Haven so special? I envision that there are MANY answers to this question. I always rely on what I continue to hear and witness throughout the Campground:

- Booming Industry Outdoor recreation has REALLY taken off everywhere and camping is now more popular than ever. Although we are missing many Canadian families, our seasonal site rentals are up considerably.

- <u>Community</u> A community is a bunch of people who share similar interests and the strength of the connections among them giving a sense of belonging. How better to describe what has been built here than that?
- <u>Volunteerism</u> This has always been a part of the culture of Blue Haven and can be seen most recently in the coming together of Volunteers to organize successful activities this season!
- <u>Friendly Faces</u> Going for a walk or golf cart ride around the park is not just about the walk or the ride. It is about saying hello to neighbors, sharing a friendly smile with a new guest, or even a simple gesture of a wave!
- <u>Memories</u> Memories are made here every day by both the young and the young-at-heart.
- <u>Traditions</u> We have several families that have camped here for generations and now the kids of yesterday are now the adults of today!

Bicycle Safety Within the Park:

We have some pretty basic guidelines for bikes within the park for the safety of EVERYONE, please make sure everyone on your site is aware of these guidelines as it is you who is ultimately responsible. This includes visitors to your site even for a day!

- New York State Vehicle and Traffic Laws apply within the park. This includes, but not limited to, riding on the right side of the road
- Everyone 14 and under must wear a helmet.
- You must obey the stop signs.
- 5 MPH Speed limit also applies!
- No riding after dark unless you have a fixed headlight.
- For your own safety, please don't follow to close to moving vehicles (i.e. Cars, trucks, hay wagon).
