<u>Important Dates to Remember:</u> - As we wind down our season, please keep in mind these important dates:

- TODAY All previous invoices for site rent and power are now OVERDUE and we can not renew your contract for next year until your account is current.
- TODAY We are now ready to begin the process of renewing contracts for the 2022 season and setting up winterizations at either the Blue Haven office or the Tom Miller Road office.
- September 13th This is our next scheduled Meter Reading. This will cover any power used from the July reading until then. Minimum rates apply. Any power used after this reading will be on your Spring Meter Reading.
- September 17th The end of season meter bills will be ready to be paid at either office.
- October 1st This is the Official Closing of our season. All Winter Storage Deposits are due by October 1st. This is a minimum of 25% of your contracted amount.
- October 11th at 4:30pm The WATER will be shut off to the entire park for the season. Please plan accordingly.
- March 15th This is when the second 25% installment of your 2022 site rent is due bringing you to 50% paid
- April 15th This is when the third 25% installment of your 2022 site rent is due bringing you to 75% paid
- May 1st Although we typically have the water on by this point, this is our Official Opening Day of camping season
- May 15th This is when the fourth and final 25% installment of your 2022 site rent is due bringing you to 100% paid.
- Mid-May Opening Meter Reading. This will cover any power used from the September 13th reading until this reading.


After a great Festival, Poker Run and Dance there are so many great volunteers to thank:
