Happy Victoria Day

To our friends that live north of the border, we wish you a **Happy Victoria Day** this Monday May 23rd. Victoria Day (French: Fête de la Reine, or "Celebration of the Queen") is a federal Canadian public holiday in honor of Queen Victoria's birthday. The date is simultaneously that on which the current Canadian sovereign's official birthday is recognized. It is sometimes informally considered the beginning of the summer season in Canada.

The holiday has been observed in Canada since at least 1845, originally falling on Victoria's actual birthday (May 24, 1819). It continues to be celebrated in various fashions across the country; the holiday has always been a distinctly Canadian observance. Victoria Day is a federal statutory holiday, as well as a holiday in six of Canada's ten provinces and all three of its territories. In Quebec, before 2003, the Monday preceding 25 May of each year was unofficially the Fête de Dollard, a commemoration of Adam Dollard des Ormeaux initiated in the 1920s to coincide with Victoria Day. In 2003, provincial legislation officially created National Patriots' Day on the same date.

Friendly Reminders:

Every Camper at Blue Haven deserves to be able to enjoy their stay. Please read through these Policy Reminders and please also make your children aware of what applies to them. If anyone has ANY questions on these or any of our policies, please contact David or Tim in the Office.

- **ALL site rent is now due.**
- **Meter Bills** - The May reading has been completed and we are in the process of posting them. Watch the Sign Board at the office for when they are ready to be paid.
- **Mail** - Please check the mailboxes in the office as there is still a considerable amount of unclaimed mail.
- **Packages** - All incoming packages are subject to the \$5 handling fee per package.
- **Site Improvements** - ALL site improvements MUST be approved by the office. This ensures that you abide by the policies, but also ensures the protection of our facilities. It is always an easier conversation before hand than it would be if your shed is too big or you move your fireplace and damage our infrastructure
- **Cars** - Only 2 cars allowed per site.
- **Speed Limit** - 5 MPH at all times.
- **Pets** - All pets must be leashed at all times. We must also have current shot records on file before bringing your pet into the park.
- **Site Appearance** - Each guest is responsible for the upkeep and 'curb appeal' of their site.
- **Quiet Hours:**
 - Weekdays - 10pm to 9am
 - Weekends and Holidays - 11pm to 10am
- **Curfew** - Under 18 must be on their site by 11pm
- **Bicycle Safety:**
 - Helmets are required for anyone 14 and younger (per NYS Law)
 - Obey the Stop Signs
 - Ride on the right
 - No riding after dark without a fixed light (not a flashlight)
 - Be aware of your surroundings.
- **Be respectful** - stay off other's sites

Golf Cart Policy Reminders

Operating Golf Carts in the Campground is a **Privilege**, and we have set these Guidelines to ensure safety for everyone in the Campground. Failure to follow these safety rules set forth will result in loss of that privilege:

- Please observe the 5mph Speed Limit
- Operator must be at least 16 years of age.
- Do NOT allow children to drive while on your lap.
- Cart Passengers MUST be limited to the number of passengers the cart is designed to carry.
- Golf Carts MUST have headlights and tail lights to operate at night.

Paddling Safety

Now that warmer weather is upon us, many people are starting to get out on the water to enjoy paddling. Whether you paddle in a canoe, a kayak, or on a stand up paddleboard, make sure you wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD).

Immersion in cold waters can quickly cause hypothermia, shock, and an inability to move and a properly fitted PFD can prevent drowning.

State law requires all children under 12 to wear a PFD while on a watercraft. Paddle safe by wearing your PFD at all times and following these other paddling safety tips:

- Large waves can form on large water bodies with steady winds. Heavy winds can create large waves on small and medium-sized water bodies. Know your abilities and the forecast for wind before setting out.
- Turn you canoe or kayak to point into large waves (or wakes from motorboats) to prevent being overturned.
- Find shelter on shore when you hear thunder.

Bass Fishing Basics (an article by takemefishing.org)

Bass fishing can be a great experience for beginners and seasoned anglers alike. For a successful day on the water, master these basic bass fishing tips and techniques.

BASS FISHING REGULATIONS

When you set out to fish for bass, be sure to familiarize yourself with regulations that govern the sport. For starters, the fishing season for bass varies by state, and in some states, like Rhode Island, there is no closed season.

SIZE LIMITS

Certain locations have minimum size limits for bass fishing, as well as maximums for the amount you can catch per day. And keep in mind that these size and catch limits may be different based on the various species of bass. In Kentucky, for instance, there's a daily limit of 15 for rock bass and six for largemouth bass.

GET A FISHING LICENSE

You'll also want to make sure you have a fishing license before setting out. Even recreational, first-time anglers may be required to have a license. In New York, anyone 16 or older has to get a license before casting. To purchase a license, check with the state's Fish & Wildlife Department or local retail establishments. They can usually be obtained by phone, online or in person. Following these tips should minimize, if not eliminate, your risk for illegal activity so that you can focus on your fishing without worry.

BASS BEHAVIOR

Just like any target species, understanding the factors that influence bass behavior is essential to mastering how to catch bass. One of the biggest impacts on the fish is the water temperature. Bass prefer warmer water, and the rise in temperature stimulates their appetite as well. But that doesn't mean they like it hot. So if you're fishing for bass in the summer months, they may actually be hunting for cooler water.

WEATHER

It's also valuable to learn how the weather can affect bass. Bass tend to shy away from the high sun and will seek shelter like a structure instead. In low light conditions, bass will be much more active and away from their hiding spots, making cloudy days or early morning or evening the best time to fish of bass.

FISHING MAPS

One of the best ways to find bass is to leverage today's available technology. Websites and fishfinders can help you pinpoint areas in a body of water that hold bass. Even fishing maps can hold the keys to their location by marking places like ledges where they like to congregate.

BASS FISHING LURES

One reason why bass are such a popular for beginners learning how to fish has to do with their appetites. Simply put, bass are not picky eaters. They will go after almost anything they can, although they do have some preferences: crayfish and bluegill are universally hunted by bass.

JIG

When it comes to lures, the most common and arguably effective type is a jig. There are various options when it comes to jigs depending on the environment in which you're fishing. For instance, a punch jig can be used in thick vegetation because it's heavier. Another good option for areas with weeds or grassy cover are casting jigs, since their sleek design is intended to penetrate.

TOPWATER LURE

For an action-packed day, you may want to try a topwater lure. A walking bait is one of the more popular types because of its versatility. While not novel, poppers are also a good choice, especially if you're trying to lure a bass out from under cover. Another favorite lure among bass anglers is the buzzbait.

PLASTIC WORMS

Even though they're not the most exciting, if you want to try your hand at plastics, go for a worm! Any bass, anywhere, will strike a finesse worm. You may want to try a rubber worm as well. Plastic crawlers are also a good way to mimic the bass' popular forage species.

SPINNERBAITS

Spinnerbaits are also very effective and can cover a large amount of water in a short period of time. Similar to crankbaits, they are suitable for nearly any condition. By stocking up on any of these lures, you're sure to have a productive day on the water!
