URGENT ELECTRICAL REQUEST

We are expecting some HOT and HUMID weather this weekend.

- PLEASE run your water heater on propane.
- PLEASE run your refrigerator on propane.
- · PLEASE CHARGE GOLF CARTS AT NIGHT.

Our guidelines state that our electrical system is designed to supply basic electrical usage only. We DO NOT GUARANTEE that every site will be able to run air conditioning. Please help us out so we can all have an enjoyable weekend. See Dave or Tim in the office with any questions. Here is an interesting article I found I reference to this:

BEFORE YOU BLOW YOUR "BREAKER"

Take a look at the chart below to add up the amperage requirements for these RV Appliances that are in almost every camper. It is surprising how fast the AMPS add up which causes breakers to trip. Knowing the AMPS of all the electrical appliances in your camper can help you manage electrical use and help prevent the inconveniences of "MY ELECTRICITY WENT OUT"

•	Air Conditioner (15,000BTU)	16AMPS
•	Electric Water Heater	12.5AMPS
•	Microwave	12.8AMPS
•	Coffee Pot	9AMPS
•	Toaster	10AMPS
•	Hair Dryer	10AMPS
•	RV Refrigerator on electric	5-8AMPS
•	12V Converter	5.5AMPS
•	TV	2AMPS
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You can easily see that in the morning if you start your Air Conditioner, with the water heater and refrigerator both on electric, then start your coffee pot, make some toast, and watch TV, you are pulling as much as 57.5AMPS when all are working at maximum capacity. Then if someone needs to fix their hair with a hair dryer, LOOK OUT! To compound the problem, each and every time a breaker trips, it weakens the Amperage protection initially rated for. In other words, if a breaker was originally rated for 30A, it might drop an Amp or two each time leading to extra unnecessary work to replace your equipment.

Pet Policy Reminder:

We ask that the following form be signed and kept on file for ALL PETS in the park. This applies to Seasonal AND Visiting Guests. If you have not signed one in a while, please see Tim.

PET POLICY

Pet Policies

- a. We are animal lovers, very fond of pets and appreciate the fact that people recognize their pets to be an integral part of their family; however, we are also aware that many people are not animal lovers. Additionally, our insurance carrier has required establishment of safeguards to prevent any unfortunate incident from occurring at Gunboat Rock Campsite, Inc. DBA Blue Haven Campground, In light of this we have established, and strictly enforce the following policies:
- b. NO PETS ARE ALLOWED, except under the following conditions for registered and seasonal campers:
 - i. Pets must be kept quiet, confined, tethered, cleaned up after & leashed at all times, when on your site and when walking the grounds. Leashes must be no longer than 6 feet and walkers must be of sufficient stature or size to maintain positive control of the leash at all times. Pets must not be allowed to annoy others in any manner, or be left unattended. It is recommended that children not walk dogs.
 - ii. Pets are NOT allowed in the following areas:
 - Bath Houses Playground
- Bath and Shower Houses North Gazebo

Pool

- Game Room
- Certain Special Events at the Ball Field
- Clubhouse
- Putting & Chipping Green
- Camp Store Display Units
- iii. Absolutely NO AGGRESSIVE PETS, or any that have previously bitten, or attacked people or another pet, are permitted at Blue Haven. Additionally, breeds of dogs which by nature, history, or perception aggressive, such as Pit Bulls, Rottweilers, and Doberman Pincers, we ask the owners to please be extra cautious with these breeds. These breeds are known to have an aggressive reputation and this will ensure the comfort and safety of fellow campers.
- c. Upon entering the campground a copy of a current rabies vaccination certificate must be submitted and filed with the office and the following affirmed:
